2011 Summer Reading Requirement for College Prep Sophomores

To foster active reading and a love of literature, college prep sophomores are required to read two novels over the summer:

The Secret Life of Bees (ISBN 9780142001745) by Sue Monk Kidd
The Glass Menagerie (ISBN 9780811214049) by Tennessee Williams

Students are expected to read critically by highlighting key passages and taking marginal notes directly in their books. Please follow these directions for notations:

1. Take the time to look up and write the definition of any word that is new to you.
2. Limit the highlighting. Highlighted passages should stand out. It is helpful to write the reason you highlighted the passage, because it is difficult to remember when school begins.
3. If you notice a repeated pattern, such as of an idea or image, make a note of it.
4. Comment on literary techniques in the text, such as setting, point of view, figurative language, irony, or use of flashbacks. Jot a note.
5. Circle every new character. Write adjectives which describe the character.
6. Comment on the internal and/or external conflicts the characters are involved in. How do they handle the conflicts? What does this say about their personalities?
7. Comment on the theme or main idea. What does the story reveal about the human condition?

All students should be ready for an objective test on this reading at the beginning of the school year in homeroom, regardless of when their English class is scheduled. They should also bring their paperback editions of these works to the first class meeting and be prepared to show evidence of active reading. To facilitate class discussions, please purchase the editions indicated above.
